

## **Lewis Shepard**

On 3 Aug 1850, Lewis, age 24, a carpenter born in Ohio, was living in Boston, Indiana, a small town in Wayne County. Martha, age 19, born in Pennsylvania, was also in the household and she was probably his wife. The census showed no “Value of Real Estate owned” so it’s likely he was renting.

By 18 July 1860, Lewis had moved to Walnut Township in Montgomery County, in the Ladoga Post Office area. He was enumerated as “Lewis Shepheard,” a “master carpenter,” age 34, born in Ohio, with the “Value of Personal Estate” listed as \$400. Again, it’s likely he was renting.

The household also included a 29-year-old female born in Ohio, difficult to read but probably recorded as “Liddy A.,” and a 10-year-old female, Martha Rasher.

The census neighbors included two blacksmiths, a cooper, a farmer, a carpenter, a physician, and a tanner, so I think it’s likely the family was living in town.

Lewis served for a short time in the 154th Regiment Infantry, Company K, during the Civil War. He mustered in as a private on 17 Mar 1865 and mustered out on 16 June 1865. Company K was primarily made up of Montgomery County residents.

In 1870, Lewis was living in the Mace Post Office area and his “Value of Real Estate” was noted as \$800 in the census. It’s likely that he bought property between 1860 and 1870. He was also listed as having personal property worth \$300. That year, his household included Lydia A., age 38, born in Ohio, who was keeping house and it’s likely that they were married.

Neighbors included a minister, a miller, a stock broker, an engineer, and a plasterer. I checked an 1878 map of the area, but I wasn’t able to find Mr. Shepard listed by name, although I might have just skipped over it. It’s possible that his residence could be located with some effort, using neighbor names as reference points.

On 5 Oct 1875, Lewis was granted a patent for a cross-cut saw handle.

On 12 Jun 1880, Lewis, 54, and Lyda [sic], 49, appear to have been living on “Mains Street” in Walnut Township, probably in Mace. This census is the first to mention relationships between household members and it confirms that Lydia was Lewis’ wife. It also suggests that Lewis’ father and mother were born in Pennsylvania and New Jersey and that Lydia’s parents were born in Pennsylvania and Ohio which might make it possible to find him in an earlier census.

The following year, on 16 Feb 1881, Lewis applied for a patent on a harrow. The signatures for Lewis on the two patent applications seem different and I’m not certain that either one is in his hand. However, if either signature matches the one on the violin label, we’ll know for certain that we have the right person.

There is no 1890 census available, but if there was, it would likely show Lewis and Lydia living in Mace.

The Mace news section of *The Daily Argus News*, published on 15 Jan 1895 in Crawfordsville, mentioned that “Mr. Lewis Shepherd” was “on the sick list.”

Lewis died in Mace on 31 March 1895 and was buried in the Oak Hill Cemetery in Crawfordsville, Montgomery, Indiana.

Lydia was enumerated in Walnut Township in 1900 living in a home that she owned free and clear. She was a widow, age 68, born May 1832 in Ohio. The census suggests that she was the mother of one child who was alive in 1900.

Based on that information, I believe that Lydia’s marriage to Lewis was her second and that Martha was her child by a first marriage. Checking further, I learned that Martha J. Rasher married Asbury Linn. According to her gravestone, she died on 9 June 1904. She’s buried in Mace. Lydia died in 1907 and was buried beside him in Crawfordsville.

I found mention of an obituary for Lewis and I've written for it. I've also requested his death certificate, hoping that it will give parent names or a place of birth. And, I've written to a FindaGrave contributor that I hope is one of Martha's descendants. I asked if there were any family stories about Lewis and I'm hoping she'll reply.

There's a pension file for Lewis and a widow's pension file for Lydia. The pension files would likely provide a lot more information about Lewis and I suspect they would be fascinating, but the cost to obtain them is not insignificant.

I suspect Lewis and Lydia would have been mentioned in the local news sections of area papers, some of which might be accessible online, but it would take some time to search them.



LEWIS SHEPARD, OF MACE, INDIANA, ASSIGNOR TO HIMSELF AND DAVID W. KENNEDY, OF SAME PLACE.

## IMPROVEMENT IN CROSCUT-SAW HANDLES.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. 172,788, dated January 25, 1876; application filed December 4, 1875.

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, LEWIS SHEPARD, of Mace, in the county of Montgomery and State of Indiana, have invented a new and useful Improvement in Crosscut-Saw Handles, of which the following is a specification:

Figure 1 is a side view of a crosscut-saw, to which my improved handles have been attached. Fig. 2 is a cross-section of the same, taken through the line  $x\ x$ , Fig. 1. Fig. 3 is a cross-section of the same, taken through the line  $y\ y$ , Fig. 1. Fig. 4 is a detail section taken through the line  $z\ z$ , Fig. 3.

Similar letters of reference indicate corresponding parts.

The object of this invention is to improve the construction of the crosscut-saw handles for which Letters Patent No. 168,421 were granted to me October 5, 1875, so as to enable the handles to be readily detached, to allow the saw to be drawn out of the kerf lengthwise, and to enable the handles to be adjusted in or out upon the saw.

The invention consists in the curved and straight handles, secured to each other at their upper ends, and provided with bolts at their lower slotted ends, in combination with the saw-blade, as hereinafter more fully described.

A represents the saw-blade. B are the curved handles, which are slotted from their lower ends to receive the saw-blade A, and to said lower ends is riveted a ring or ferrule,  $b^1$ . The edge of the ferrule  $b^1$  enters a notch,  $a'$ , in the lower edge of the end of the saw-blade A, as shown in Figs. 1 and 4.

In the handle B, at the upper end of the slot, is formed a mortise,  $b^2$ , in which is inserted a wedge-key, C, the lower edge of which is grooved to receive and fit upon the upper

edge of the saw-blade A, and which, when driven into place, secures the handle B to the saw-blade A firmly.

With this construction the handle B can be readily detached, and leaves the end of the saw-blade free, so that it can be drawn out of the kerf when, from driving a wedge into said kerf, or from any other cause, it may be necessary.

When the saw is to be used by a single sawyer a straight handle, D, is connected with the curved handle B by securing the upper end of said curved handle B to the upper end of said straight handle D.

In this case a bolt, E, is passed through the slotted lower ends of handles B D, and the said handles are clamped to the saw-blade A by tightening up the nuts of the bolts E.

By this construction, by loosening the bolts E the handles B D may be moved in and out upon the saw-blade A, to adjust the saw for sawing small or large timber.

It will be observed that the bolts E enter the notches or cavities of the teeth, and thus prevent the handles from moving when the said bolts are tightened up.

Having thus described my invention, I claim as new and desire to secure by Letters Patent—

The curved and straight handles B D, secured to each other at their upper ends, and provided with bolts E at their slotted lower ends, in combination with the saw-blade A, substantially as herein shown and described.



